




DAY

My name is Yasmin Praveen and my father's name is Mustaqim Ansari. I live in Dumarbeda village. Our society discourages Muslim girls from getting an education and venturing far from home after the age of 15.

I met Jiya Naz who is a community mobilizer working for ASMITA as a part of Jugni program and she wanted to form girls group in our village. During group meeting, Jiya Ji spoke about the importance of education and encouraged us to pursue our goals beyond our village. Previously, I was too shy to speak up in public. But after attending the meeting, I felt empowered and began to express myself openly. I spoke about the importance of teamwork and continuous learning. The group not only organizes meetings but also provides training programs. These programs help us overcome limitations placed on girls and empower us to become capable individuals. We are trained to intervene if we witness violence in our village.

Observed National Girl Child Day with activities promoting the rights and welfare of girls in society.
